Highlights from the January SLB Meeting
FINANCE REPORT
☐ The 2025 church budget of \$358,818.00 was approved.
☐ A summary of the recommendations from E.S. Evans' audit of Trinity's finances was presented.
Included among the recommendations, but not limited to these, were the following:
Conduct monthly reconciliations of ALL accounts.
2. Include ALL income and expenditures in ALL accounts in financial reports.
3. Require receipts and payment approval forms for ALL purchases.
4. Since the CCCC is utilizing Trinity's Employer Identification Number (EIN), create a formal
agreement with the CCCC regarding all financial actions of the CCCC.
Overall, the audit did not uncover any glaring issues and was helpful in revealing areas that can
make Trinity's financial practices even better.
TRUSTEES REPORT
☐ There are several areas needing attention but financial constraints are limiting the ability to
address all of them at this time. Listed in order from least urgent to most urgent.
A. Parking Lot: It badly needs resurfacing but is a low priority compared to other greater needs at
this time, so for now the lot will continue to be "patched" as needed.
B. Plumbing Issue: Because of a recent failure of the main drain pipe, a study needs to be
conducted; however, this, too, will have to wait.
C. Boilers: The church building has three boilers, two in the main building and one in the
educational wing. There is a leak in one of the boilers in the main building; yet, Smith-Boughan, with whom Trinity currently has a maintenance contract, says the boiler in the educational wing
needs to be replaced. The cost to repair the leaks is \$30,000/section, not including labor, and there
are four sections/boiler. The cost to replace a boiler is \$200,000-\$250,000, again, not including
labor. A special committee has been formed to work just on this project. Along with Pastor Jim and
head custodian Rob Stidham, the following board
members were named to this Boiler Project Team: Sharon Walsh from the Finance Team, Trustee
Representatives John Mulder and Dennis Hefner, and Beth Bartels as an At-Large member.
D. Cracks in Sanctuary Walls: An engineering assessment was conducted to determine the
structural integrity of the walls in the sanctuary, especially where there are cracks above the stained
-glass windows and elsewhere. The initial comment by the assessor(s) was that the cracks might
be intentional and necessary. Trustees are awaiting the final assessment report.
☐ It was determined during last year's parsonage inspection that new carpet is needed in three
rooms in the parsonage—the living room, the master bedroom and the basement. The Organization
and Furnishings Team will be working with Jami Nathan in selecting carpet samples for gathering
the needed quotes for this project.
PERSONNEL REPORT
□ In order to do what can be done to keep Trinity's good, hourly staff here, the SLB approved cost-
of-living and additional raises for all non-pastoral staff. The suggested increased salaries are
already reflected in the 2025 budget.
MINISTRY UPDATES
□ Missions
1. The Turner Love Offering met its Christmas offering goal and donated \$1,074.83 to 6 local
groups.
2. The Easter Offering will go to the Lima Music Academy.
3. The Missions Team is in contact with Family Promise to determine the best means for utilizing funds left in Trinity's suspense account that are designated specifically for this ministry.
□ Worship
□ Worship 1. The February sermon series will be on the four graces.
March's message theme is "Let the Children Come."
3. Lent will be focusing on "Everyone Has Monkeys" with weekly topics such as Change, Fear,
Relationship, Finance, and Addiction.

### **Highlights from the February SLB Meeting**

### SHARING BY PASTOR JIM

□ Conference News: The UM Church in Ohio is busy combining the East Ohio and West Ohio conferences into one Ohio Conference, the finality of which should be completed within three years. This move towards one, statewide conference is indicative, too, of the issue of fewer pastors to serve in local churches, leading the conference to seek new ways to cover the gaps.

□ Local News: In the spirit of joining together as a unified body of believers who identify as United Methodists, the local Lima area UM churches are planning a united Pentecost service on Sunday, June 8, 2025. Our current district superintendent, Jim Wilson, will lead this combined service. Participating UM churches are Trinity, Shawnee, Forest Park, Elida St. Paul, Cairo, and Cridersville. □ One final announcement is the appointment of Don Wilson as the new Western Lakes District Superintendent effective July 1, 2025. Wilson is the first black D.S. assigned to our district. His focus is in encouraging us to "be the hands and feet of Christ in this place."

### FINANCE REPORT

- ☐ The Platt Trust Funds yielded a higher-than-expected dividend. Though good news, these additional funds will not affect the annual budget as approved in January.
- ☐ The Finance Committee is focusing on improving four areas of financial stewardship as identified in the recent audit of Trinity's finances.
- 1. Set a monetary threshold for expenditures not requiring approval of the SLB as a whole and utilize the executive group to assist with these approvals when needed.
- 2. Tighten up the process of accounting for all credit card purchases.
- 3. Utilize more volunteers for counting donations so no staff is involved with this.
- 4. Work out details regarding the agreement/relationship of the CCCC to our church budget. TRUSTEES REPORT
- ☐ The purchase of carpeting for living room, master bedroom, and basement at the parsonage was approved by the board
- □ Criterium-Liszkay Engineers recently completed a visual inspection at Trinity to evaluate the cracks in the sanctuary at the interface of the domed plaster ceiling and exterior walls. The findings indicated no significant movement of the building super-structure. However, several recommendations were made including the following:
- 1. Complete stated maintenance items for extending the expected useful life of the building.
- 2. Carry out a more complete assessment of the condition of the plaster and the connection of the lathes to the suspended wood framing
- 3. Be prepared for possible repairs/replacement for the plaster and the lathe.
- ☐ Trinity is facing a serious and expensive issue in regards to the buildings boilers.
- 1. Of the two boilers in the main building, one is currently working while the other, per information from Smith-Boughan, will cost \$50,000 to repair, but such a repair should give it another 15 years of life.
- 2. The boiler in the education wing is thought to be the original placed in 1959. Smith-Boughan indicated that parts for this boiler are no longer available and it should be replaced. Smith-Boughan is working on submitting a bid for a replacement boiler.
- 3. A second opinion is being sought from Wellman Services, but other than these two local companies, the only other companies that deal with this kind of boiler unit are located in Dayton and Columbus, which would add significant travel expenses to the cost of the project.
- 4. A subcommittee has been set up to determine how best to finance this large project.

### PERSONNEL REPORT

There were a few reports from board members regarding topics and comment they discussed with staff members for whom they serve as liaisons.

### MINISTRY UPDATES: Discipleship

An extensive schedule of youth group activities was shared with the board members.



## In other words....

### Hymn of Promise, by Natalie Sleeth

In the bulb there is a flower; in the seed, an apple tree; In cocoons, a hidden promise: butterflies will soon be free! In the cold and snow of winter there's a spring that waits to be, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

Rev. Dr. Ronald Sleeth was the Homiletics (Preaching) Professor at Iliff School of Theology in Denver, CO. He was a beloved member of the faculty and a favorite of students. His wife, Natalie, was a hymn writer. When he was diagnosed with a brain tumor in the mid 1980s, he set out like any good preacher to plan out his own funeral. He asked his wife to write a new hymn for the occasion; Hymn of Promise was the result of his request.

There's a song in every silence, seeking word and melody; There's a dawn in every darkness, bringing hope to you and me. From the past will come the future; what it holds, a mystery, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

Consider seriously for a moment and reflect; the deep, deep faith of this couple. In the face of a fatal diagnosis, to speak, write sing words of hope and promise. It is one of the strongest witness I know to facing a world that ever more dark and pessimistic with the hope that is Christ.

In our end is our beginning; in our time, infinity; In our doubt there is believing; in our life, eternity, In our death, a resurrection; at the last, a victory, Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see.

During the season of Lent, we can get caught up in the darkness of of our own reflections, in confronting the negatives powers that we need to confront. We can get caught up in the darkness of the story of the Passion narrative and the guilts of our own place in the midst of that story. But that is also why I like to use verse three of this hymn as my sung benediction at the end of every funeral service, at the end of worship throughout the season of Lent. That in the midst of the challenges, we remember that Hope has the last word.
